


# Quick Tips For Using Your LintEater Dryer Vent Cleaning System:



When removing your system from the box, be sure to check the box thoroughly for all parts and accessories.

**The *LintEater*<sup>TM</sup> System includes:**

					
5 - 36" Long flexible rods screw together to reach into vents up to 15' from one end.	1 - Self-feeding 4" Auger Brush makes multiple turns in your vent.	1 - Vacuum Adapter. Connect to a shop vac to collect the lint while rotary brushing.	1 - Blockage Removal Tool. Removes heavy blockages and clears gutter downspouts.	1 - Large 2.5" dia. Lint Brush with Exceptional 42" Reach when connected to one flexible rod.	1 - Dryer/Blower Adapter. Safeguards the blower wheel by stopping the Auger Brush when using the dryer air or a blower to remove the lint while rotary brushing.

The LintEater is used in combination with a drill, to snake the cleaning rods through your dryer vent ducting. Before starting, it would be a good idea to make sure your drill is fully charged, if it is powered via batteries.

**THIS IS IMPORTANT:** Make sure your connections are on fairly tight - and once you begin drilling, be sure you set your drill to rotate in a clockwise fashion. Once you have extended the cleaning rods at maximum capacity - DO NOT and I repeat DO NOT - set your drill to the counter-clockwise position to pull the rods out. The rods could become loosened - and you will be left with stuck cleaning rods in your dryer vent duct - which is NOT fun to try and get out.

You can make good use of a [Shop Vac](#) if you have one handy. The vacuum/blower can be placed on the opposite end of where you are drilling to assist in removing the lint build-up.

Some homes have dryer duct termination points that are on the roof of your home. You'll have to get to the vent, which may require the use of a ladder. Here in California, we have tile roofs, in order to access the vent, you may have to remove some tiles. The vent will more than likely be screened, and you'll need to pull it away from the duct collar attachment. You should have some heavy duty roofing sealer/glue to reseal the duct to the collar once you have completed the cleaning.
