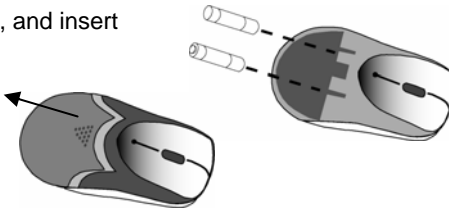




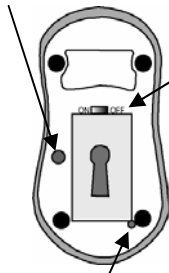
# Stowaway<sup>®</sup> Travel Mouse for Microsoft<sup>®</sup> Pocket PC/Windows Mobile<sup>™</sup> 2003, Apple Macintosh, and Microsoft Windows XP Quick Start Guide

## Preparing the Mouse for Use:

1. Open battery compartment, and insert mouse batteries as indicated.



3. Discoverable button



2. Power switch

4. Discoverable LED

According to the specifics of your host computer, noted below, you'll be required to place the mouse in Discoverable mode so it can be discovered by the host. Press the *Discoverable mode* button. A Discoverable LED will light when it is discoverable.

If it fails to connect, power cycle the mouse and repeat. **NOTE:** Your actual mouse design may vary.

## Apple Macintosh Installation

**NOTE:** The Mouse driver is supplied by the Apple OS X Operating System.

Before you connect the Stowaway Travel Mouse on your Apple Macintosh computer, determine that your machine is Bluetooth enabled with either a built-in Bluetooth component, or via an external hardware adaptor (dongle).

**Note:** It is not necessary to disable or remove your existing mouse software or hardware to use the Stowaway Travel Mouse

### Creating a Paired Connection with your Apple Macintosh Computer:

1. Install the Bluetooth Dongle, if necessary.
2. Click the Bluetooth icon next to the clock on the top toolbar and select “Set up Bluetooth Device”. This will launch the Bluetooth Setup Assistant.
3. Power on the Stowaway Travel Mouse by switching the Power switch to ON and press the Discoverable button to make it detectable by the Bluetooth software on your Macintosh.
4. Select Mouse and Continue.
5. Select the “Stowaway Travel Mouse” in the list of discovered devices and Continue.
6. After the mouse is successfully linked with your Macintosh, the mouse pointer will immediately begin responding to mouse movement and button presses, similar to your standard mouse. Refer to the User Guide for your Macintosh to modify mouse functionality within the Macintosh Operating System.

## Windows XP Installation

**NOTE:** The Mouse driver is supplied by the Windows XP Operating System.

Before you connect the Stowaway Travel Mouse to your Windows XP computer, determine that your PC is Bluetooth enabled with either a built-in Bluetooth component, or via an external hardware adaptor (dongle).

NOTE: It is not necessary to disable or remove your existing mouse software or hardware to use the Stowaway Travel Mouse.

### Creating a Paired Connection with your Windows XP Computer:

1. Install the Bluetooth Dongle, if necessary, and launch the accompanying Bluetooth software on your PC.
2. Refer to the instructions included with your Bluetooth software on the process for Connecting (unsecured connections) and Pairing Devices (secured connections).
3. Power on the Stowaway Travel Mouse by switching the Power switch to ON and press the Discoverable button to make it detectable by the Bluetooth software on your PC.
4. Begin device detection, and locate the “Stowaway Travel Mouse” among any found devices.
5. Establish a link between the computer and the mouse. (Refer to the User Guide included with your Bluetooth software for instructions on how to do this.) Note: There is no need to create a Secured connection for the mouse with “Pair Devices”, available from the Mouse right-click menu. This option exists for Bluetooth devices that require signal encryption.
6. After the mouse is successfully linked with your PC, the mouse pointer will immediately begin responding to mouse movement and button presses, similar to your standard mouse. When used within the Windows XP operating system, the Stowaway Travel Mouse is governed by the functionality within the Windows Control Panel > Mouse applet. Refer to the User Guide or onscreen help for your PC, on the Mouse applet, to modify mouse functionality within Windows.

## Pocket PC Installation

Before you install the Stowaway Universal Bluetooth Keyboard and Mouse application on your Pocket PC device, it is a good idea to back up your data using ActiveSync®. Delete any other keyboard software you have previously installed on your device to avoid potential conflicts.

### Pairing the Mouse with your Pocket PC:

1. Connect your handheld device to its synchronization cradle/cable and establish a connection between the computer and your PDA using ActiveSync.
2. Insert the CD-ROM into the CD-ROM driver on your PC.
3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
4. For proper operation, the driver must be installed into **Main Memory**.
5. When the installation is complete, reset your PDA when prompted.
6. Select the **Stowaway Travel Mouse** from the Device Setup Screen and tap **Setup**.
7. You will be prompted to select the **Mouse Pointer Mode** to operate under. Tap **Enhanced** (for most PDAs) and **Yes** at the following next screen. Follow the onscreen prompts if Enhanced Mode does not work properly. The PDA will reset.
8. Next you will be prompted to **Confirm** the Mouse Pointer Mode. If the PDA display is working correctly, select Enhanced again and OK.
9. Power on the Stowaway Travel Mouse by switching the Power switch to ON and press the Discoverable button to make it detectable by the Bluetooth software on your PDA.
10. Tap **Connect** to Initialize and Scan for the mouse. **Note:** If your Bluetooth Settings limit Bluetooth access to your PDA by Paired/Secured devices only, you will be prompted whether you would like to **Make PDA accessible**. Making the PDA accessible changes your Bluetooth settings to allow the mouse to reconnect with a button press (left, middle, right), if your PDA powers down. Alternatively, choosing not to make the PDA accessible will retain your current Bluetooth accessibility settings and require you to rediscover the mouse each time you reconnect.
11. Click with the mouse pointer in the red block to Verify Connection.
12. Mouse is immediately enabled.
