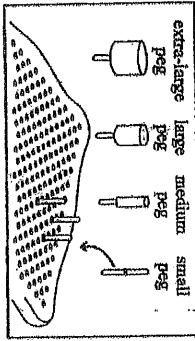




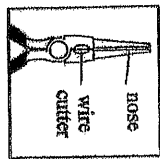
Wild Wire™ Jig

Contents: Wild Wire™ Jig, 15 small pegs, 2 medium pegs, 2 large pegs, 1 extra-large peg, wire, needle nose pliers and patterns.

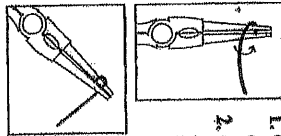


Wild Wire™ Jig
The jig is a platform on which you can create many wire shapes. Pegs fit into the holes of the jig, and can be arranged in different ways to create different shapes.



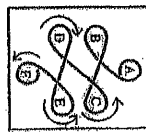
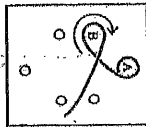
Needle Nose Pliers
These pliers have 2 round metal tips that grip and bend the wire. To use the wire cutter, open the handles of the pliers and slip the wire inside the wire cutter. Squeeze the handles together to cut the wire. Twist the wire back and forth until it breaks. Safety goggles are recommended when using wire cutter.

Shaping the wire:



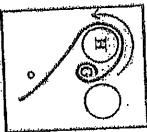
1. Grip one end of the wire in the nose of the pliers. Place the end about 1/4" down from the tip of the pliers.
2. Carefully wind the wire around the nose of the pliers, creating a tight loop. This can be done by either turning the pliers or by pulling the wire around.
3. Slip the loop off the pliers. Place the looped end of the wire inside the nose of the pliers and squeeze. This will force the sharp end of the wire to lay flat with the loop. Practice making a loop at the end of the wire until you are able to do so easily. Most wire shapes created on the jig begin with this type of loop (called anchor loop).

Using the Wild Wire Jig:
1. Lay the jig over the pattern printed on the front of the instruction sheet. Line up the holes of the jig with the circles on the pattern.

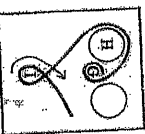


2. Place a small peg at positions A, B, C, D, E and F.
3. Cut a 5" piece of wire and make an anchor loop at one end.
4. Slip the anchor loop over peg A. Bring the wire around peg B with your fingers, looping it tightly around and pushing it down to the base of the peg.
5. Continue to wrap the wire around the peg as shown. Lift the shape off the jig and cut off the excess wire. Tighten the final loop.

To make a heart-shaped design, lay the jig over the pattern again. Place a small peg at positions G and I. Place a large peg at positions H and J. Cut a 5 1/2" piece of wire and make an anchor loop at one end.



7. Slip anchor loop on peg G. Bring wire tightly around the outside of peg H.

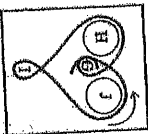


8. Bring the wire around peg I.

10. To connect the wire shapes, you may need to create a wire ring. Make a loop at the end of a piece of wire, then cut off the rest of the wire after the loop. Use pliers to open and close the loop.



9. Bring the wire around peg J, then around peg G again. Lift the shape off the jig, cut off the excess wire and tighten the final loop.



11. Join the wire shapes together to create a chain for a necklace or a bracelet. Use the heart as a pendant for a necklace.
