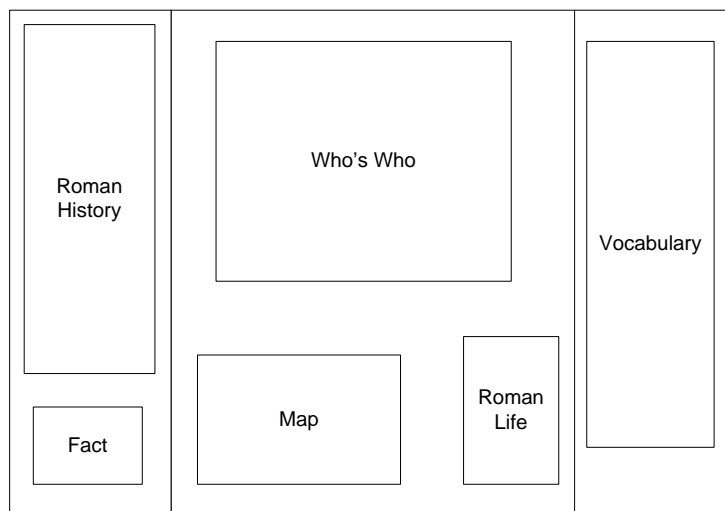


You will need 3 folders of any color. Take each one and fold both sides toward the original middle fold and make firm creases on these folds (Figure 1). Then glue (and staple if needed) the backs of the small flaps together (Figure 2).

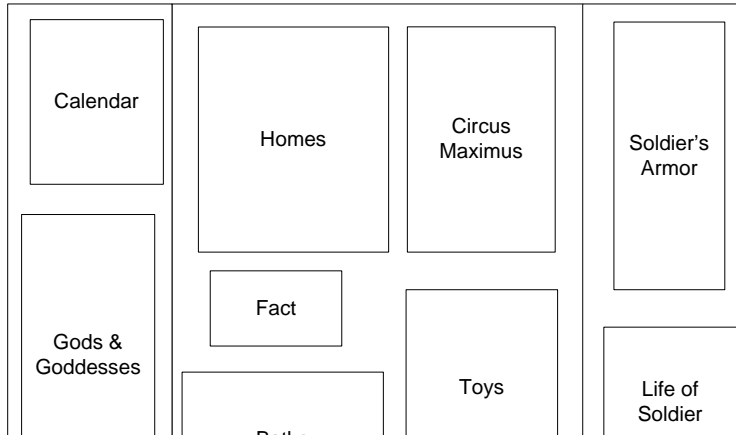


This is the "Layout" for your lapbook. The shapes are not exact on the layout, but you will get the idea of where each booklet should go inside your lapbook.

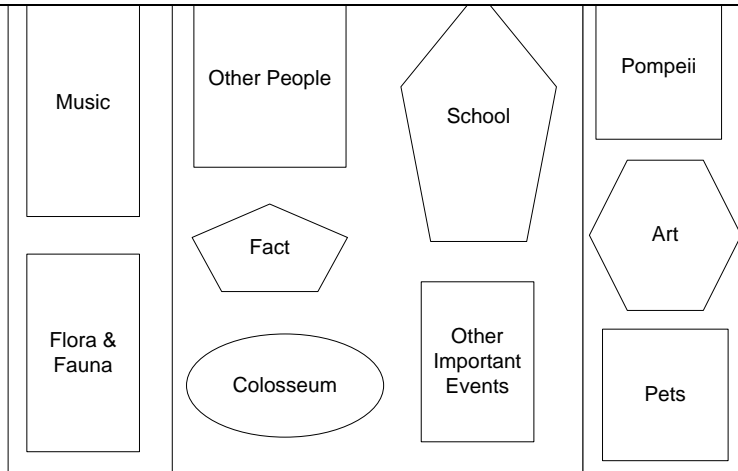
Inside of 1st Folder:



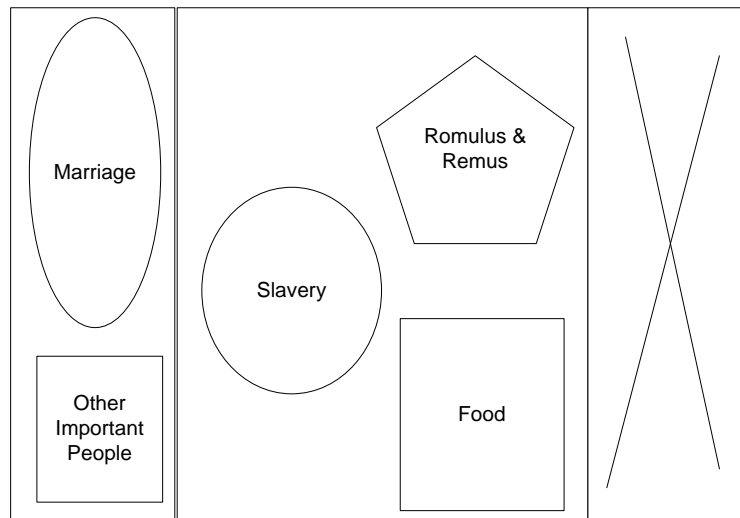
Inside of 2nd Folder:



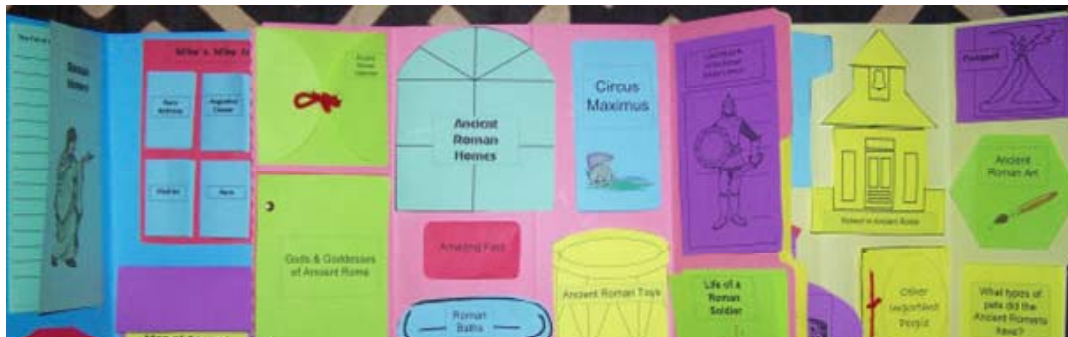

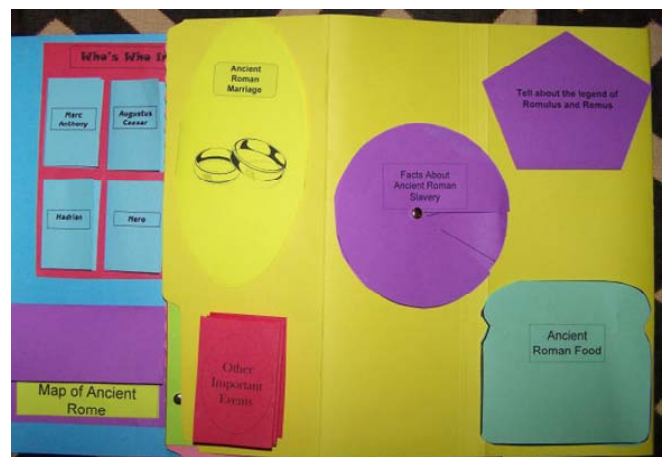
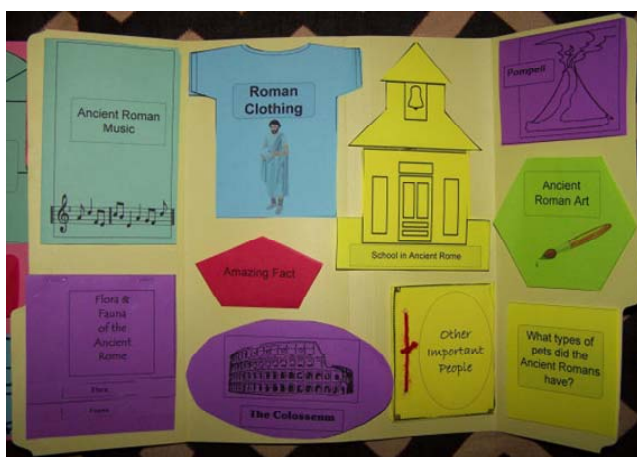
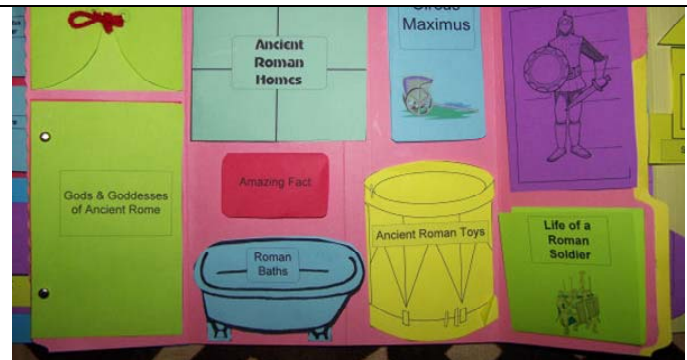
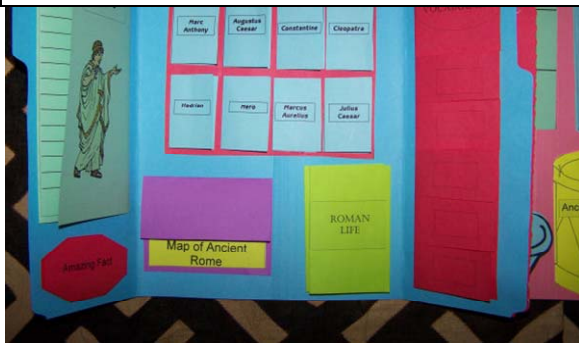
Outside/Back of Folder 3:

Product Suggestions:

**** Lapbook Base Folders:**

We usually use the basic colored file folders that are letter-size. You can get them at Wal-Mart or any office supply store. Some have tabs, and others do not, but tabs really don't matter. If you like your folders to line up perfectly, you can cut the tabs off before assembling the lapbook base.

**** Paper:**

For most of our booklets, we use 24# colored paper. Occasionally, we use white, but then we mount those pages to colored paper. Also, we use 60# cardstock for pockets and notecards. You can also get these at the stores mentioned above.

****Adhesives:**

For assembling the lapbook base, we have found that hot glue works great...but you have to get it in place and the folders together FAST before it has time to cool off. Also, don't let your little ones tackle that one on their own! We've had our share of burned little fingers around here! For gluing booklets into the lapbook base, we like several different types of glue sticks: UHU, Office Depot, Duck Brand, and Scotch are some of our favorites. The tape/adhesive rollers are nice too, but they are a bit more expensive than glue sticks. The Xyron is very nice...but expensive.

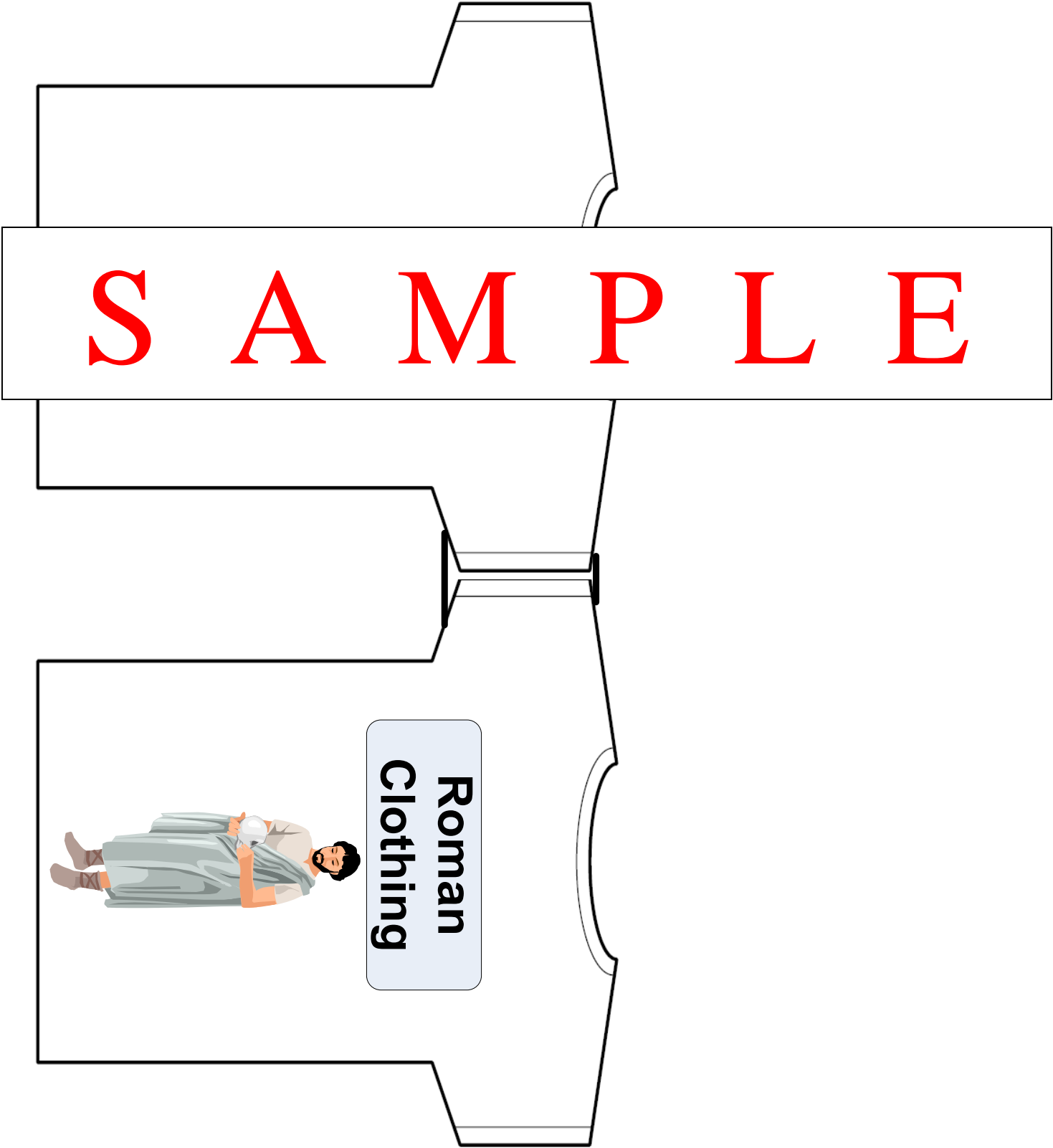
ALL lapbooks include specific instructions for cutting and assembling all of the booklets. The instructions are easy to follow. There is also a “Teacher’s Guide” included, and it provides all of the information that you need in order to teach the topic.

The instructions for what to write inside each booklet are very clearly written, so that your child will have no problem completing the booklets on his own, if you choose.

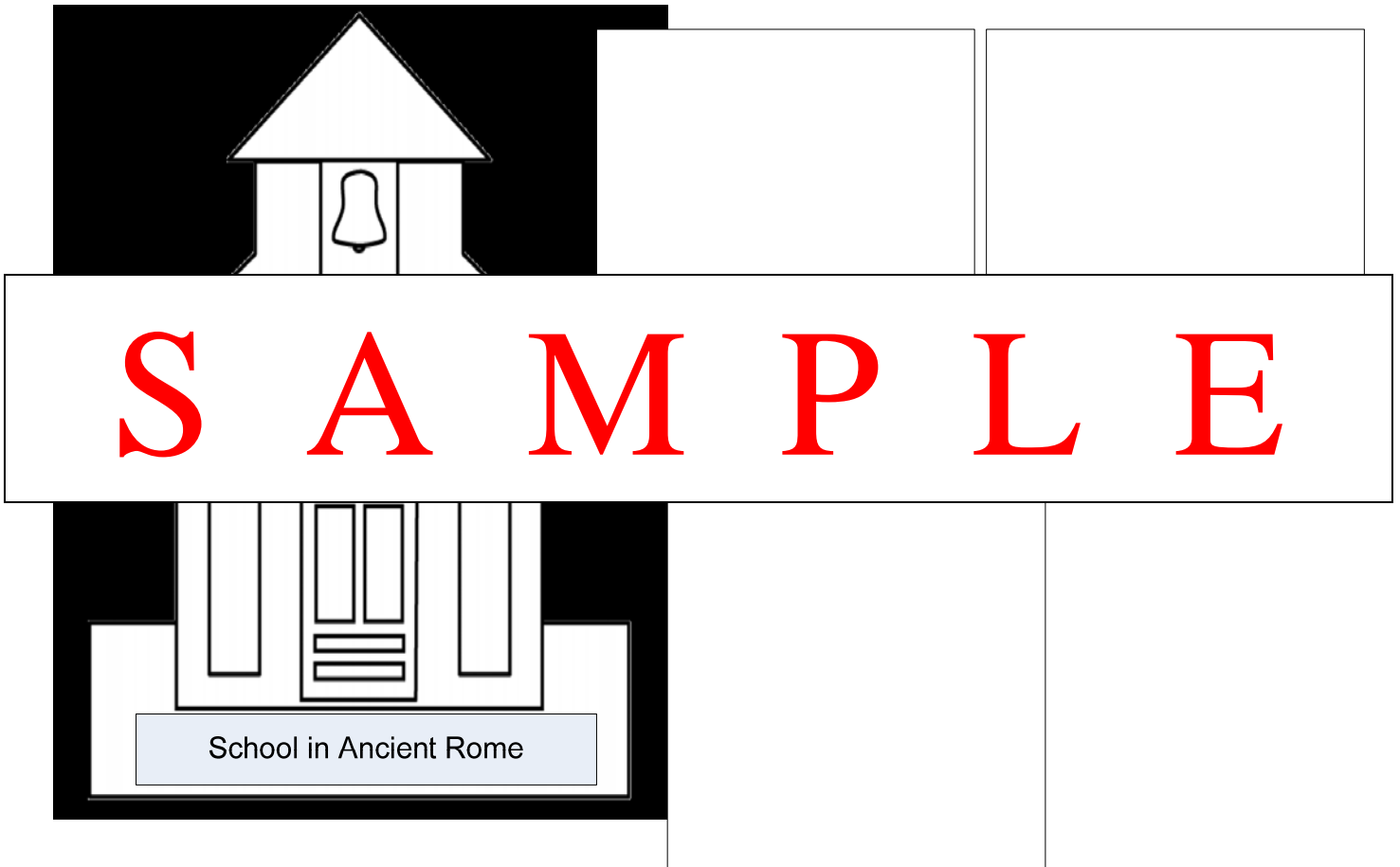
Regardless of the ages specified in the lapbook description, you may easily “tweak” the product to be used with younger or older students. You may choose to add an additional folder, require research to be done by the student, allow for one-word or picture answers, etc. There are many ways to adapt the product to fit your homeschooling needs.

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Following are only 3 of the many booklets included in the lapbook product.

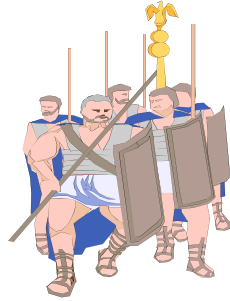


Roman Clothing Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet, being sure to keep the “sleeves” connected. Then, fold along the center of the “sleeves,” so that the title and graphic are on the front.



School Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page of the booklet. Stack the 3 squares behind the schoolhouse page. Staple them all together with with one staple through the bottom of the roof of the schoolhouse.
