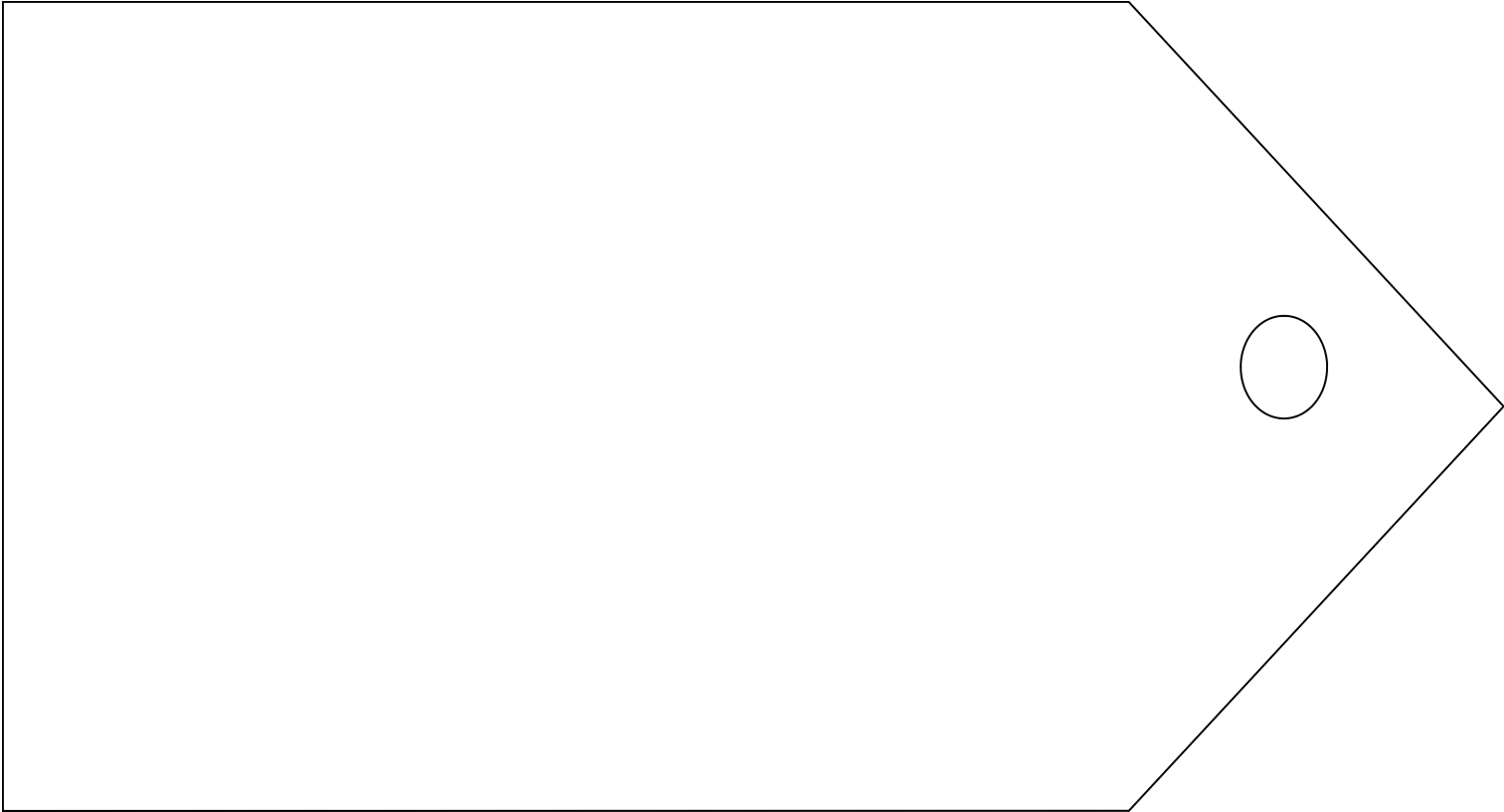

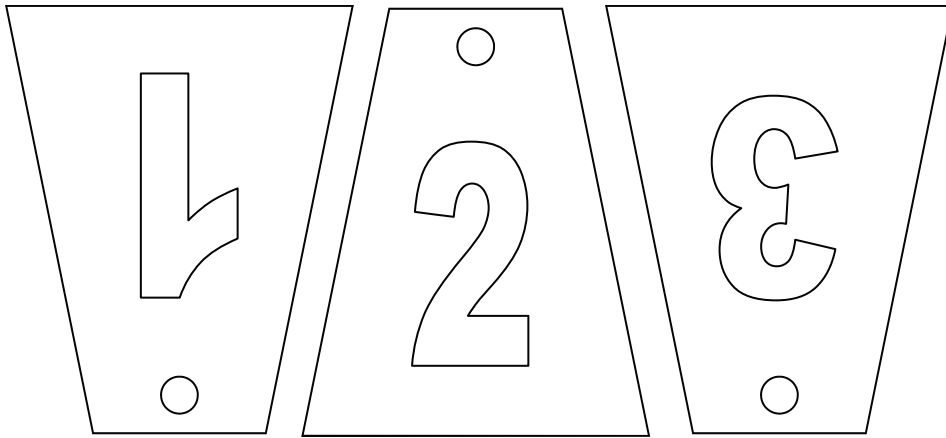

Tags of Time Directions

Print a tag for each chapter as needed. Print out all other embellishment pages as needed. Color and cut out the needed elements for the chapter you are reading. The sequence of events slips and vocabulary must be placed in order. All other elements may be placed creatively. Use markers, crayons, stickers, fibers, etc. to add interest to your tag. Punch a hole through the collection of tags and bind together with fiber to create a Tag Booklet when the reading book is completed. Every tag will have a Ch.#, clip art graphic from a main idea in the chapter, and a sequence of events (to be placed in order). Vocabulary words can be put on the back of the tag in order.

As the student reads and comes across these words, read the definitions.

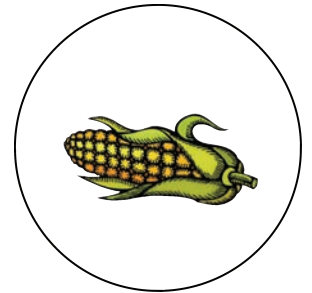
